HOUSE Groups: Discussion Questions:

Galatians 1:1-10

(Memory Verse)

Galatians 1:10 NKJV - *For do I now persuade men, or God? Or do I seek to please men? For if I still pleased men, I would not be a bondservant of Christ.*

(Galatians 1:1-3): **1** Paul, an apostle (not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father who raised Him from the dead), **2** and all the brethren who are with me, To the churches of Galatia: **3** Grace to you and peace from God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ,

Question: What was the main attack against Paul from these men that had crept into the church?

Question: What does the devil seek to accomplish when attacking the messenger of God's word?

Question: Why is it so vitally important to be confident in what God has called you to do?

Question: How does the Christian get attacked, and what do you do to overcome those attacks?

Question: What is grace, and how does it bring us peace?

(Galatians 1:4-5): **4** who gave Himself for our sins, that He might deliver us from this present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, **5** to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.

Question: How are we to be in the world, but not *of* the world?

Question: How does the Lord deliver us from the strength of evil?

Question: When will we be delivered from then substance/presence of evil?

Question: What does it mean when it says that Jesus gave Himself for our sins?

(Galatians 1:6-7): **6** I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel, **7** which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ.

Question: What did the Galatians turn to as they turned away from the Gospel?

Question: What did these evil men do to the Galatian church? (v.7)

Question: How does the enemy seek to pervert the Gospel, and how does that perversion cause problems in the church?

READ: *2 Timothy 4:3-4*

(Galatians 1:8-9): **8** But even if we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed. **9** As we have said before, so now I say again, if anyone preaches any other gospel to you than what you have received, let him be accursed.

Question: Why does Paul say the same thing twice?

Question: How does Paul seek to safeguard the church from false doctrine?

Question: How do you protect yourself against false teachings?

READ: *2 Corinthians 11:13-15*

(Galatians 1:10): **10** For do I now persuade men, or God? Or do I seek to please men? For if I still pleased men, I would not be a bondservant of Christ.

Question: Why is it that some people may not want to hear what God's Word says?

Question: Why would people rather listen to a pastor tell them what they *want* to hear as opposed to what they *need* to hear?

Question: What are some of the dangers of being more concerned with pleasing the people around than pleasing the Lord?

Question: How do you overcome being a man-pleaser?
